## A Lecture Series on the Giants

**N**o, not the NY Giants football team! The giants on whose shoulders we are standing here in the Archdiocese of New York. The history of this Archdiocese is the story of people; courageous individuals who dared to preach the Gospel in word and work despite oppression and danger and even official Church censure. There was Archbishop “Dagger John” Hughes, who championed the cause of newly arrived, impoverished immigrants, and dared to build a Cathedral “in the country,” far north of the then city of New York – and did it with the pennies of Irish servant girls when wealthy people called it “Hughes’ Folly”. He so angered the Vatican that he was never given the red hat of a Cardinal. Elizabeth Ann Seton was a wealthy Episcopalian who, as a young widow, found God in the Catholic Church, then the Church of poor immigrants, and suffered the contempt of her family and friends as she became a Catholic and later founded the Sisters of Charity. Many other courageous women religious left their homes in Europe to answer the call to teach the Gospel in New York. As Catholics began to prosper, an intellectual class arose and from their midst a Protestant convert, Isaac Hecker, who had been dismissed from the Redemptorist Order for disagreeing with his superiors founded an order of priests, the Paulists, whose mission would be to explain and situate the Catholic faith in American society. In the twentieth century a new wave of immigrants from Europe led to a need for fairness and justice in labor practices. The Jesuits opened a “Labor School” in Manhattan to educate workers and to help them fight for basic rights. The most famous of these priests was Pete Corridan, S.J., of *On the Waterfront* fame. Finally, John Courtney Murray, S.J., born in Manhattan, was arguably the foremost Ameri-

can theologian of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. His efforts on behalf of religious liberty and the relationship between church and state earned him the censure of Rome. He missed the first session of the Second Vatican Council because he had been silenced, but Francis Cardinal Spellman insisted that he be allowed to bring Fr. Murray to Rome as his *peritus* or theologian for the second, third, and fourth sessions, where he was instrumental in drafting the “Declaration on Religious Freedom.”

“...our heritage in faith teaches us valuable lessons for our lives today.”

“We cannot go to heaven alone .... Otherwise, God will say to us, where are the others?” these words of Dorothy Day, one of the great figures of Catholic New York, capture the essence of the history of the Catholic Church in New York. They remind us that we are part of a very big picture. It is all too easy for us to focus on our individual lives and to ignore the fact that we are part of a community that is larger than ourselves. When we forget that, we lose a powerful source of inspiration; when we remember, we learn that our heritage in faith teaches us valuable lessons for our lives today.

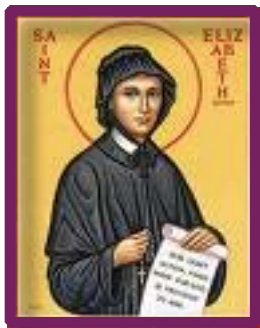


Icon of Isaac Hecker, Founder of the Paulists

**I**n this spirit, we at St. Ignatius are proud to introduce the Elizabeth Sciutto Memorial Lecture Series as our way of commemorating the bicentennial of the Archdiocese of New

York. We are fortunate to have some of the foremost American theologians and spiritual thinkers with us to lecture on some of the “giants” of our New York history.

**O**n October 11, Professor David O’Brien, Ph.D, Loyola Professor of Catholic Studies at The College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, Massachusetts, will kick off the series with a consideration of “The Rise of the Catholic Intellectual: Isaac Hecker and the Paulists.” Professor O’Brien is the author of six books on American Catholic History and has served as President of the American Catholic Historical Association. He has received the Theodore M. Hesburgh Award for Distinguished service to Catholic Higher Education and the Pedro Arrupe Award for service to Jesuit Higher Education. He serves on the board of Trustees of Voice of the Faithful, the Board of Directors of Catholics in Al-

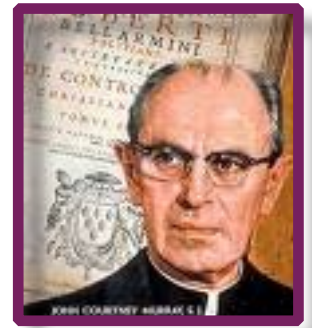


**Icon of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton**

liance for the Common Good, and the Advisory Board of the Curran Center for American Catholic Studies at Fordham University.

**I**n the Spring, the lectures continue with an exploration of the influence of Women Religious in the history of New York. On April 3, our principal speaker will be Sister Regina Bechtle, S.C., Ph.D., Director of Charism Resource for the Sisters of Charity of New York, and former Director of the Center for Leadership and Spirituality at the College of Mt. St. Vincent. Sister Regina has co-edited a four-volume collection of the letters of Elizabeth Seton and has given papers at several conferences on the History of Women Religious. She served on her Congregation’s Leadership Team for eight years and was active in the Archdiocesan Council of Women Religious and the national Leadership Conference of Women Religious. Joining Regina for a round table reflection following her talk will be Sister Dorothy Ann Kelly, OSU, Provincial Superior of the Eastern Province of the Ursulines of the Roman Union, and former President and Chancellor of The College of New Rochelle, the first Catholic college for women in New York State; Sister Bridget Driscoll, RSHM, former President of Marymount College, Tarrytown, and Sister Patricia Vetrano, R.S.M., of the Leadership Team of the Sisters of Mercy of New York.

On April 24, we are very pleased to welcome Rev. Joseph Komonchak, a priest of the Archdiocese of New York, who is the John C. and Gertrude P. Hubbard Professor of Religious Studies in the School of Theology and Religious Studies at The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. Considered a leading Ecclesiologist in the American Church, Fr. Komonchak is currently working on a biography of John Courtney Murray, and will be sharing his insights on “John Courtney Murray and American Religious Freedom.”

**C**losing the bicentennial series is Dr. James Fisher, Ph.D., Co-Director of the Francis and Ann Curran Center for American Catholic Studies at Fordham University. Dr. Fisher has just completed a book project, *Covering the Waterfront; Labor Priests and Longshoremen in the Port of New York and New Jersey*, which we are hoping may be published by the time of his talk here on Fr. Pete Corridan and the Jesuit Labor Priests.

When I was a freshman in college, our Dean used to tell us frequently that we were “pygmies on the shoulders of giants.” As I consider the history of New York, I feel the truth of that. I hope you will join us in getting to know both the historical giants and our current lecturers, giants as well in the history of our Church. A wine and cheese reception will follow each presentation so that we can get to know each other and our distinguished guests better. Here’s to another two hundred years!

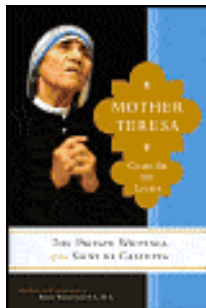
### SILENCE IS NOT GOLDEN
