Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

“Silence Falls on 84th Street”

In the coming week, the sound of children on 84th Street hurrying to and from school and playing at recess will fall silent for the next two months when Saint Ignatius Loyola Grammar School is closed for summer vacation. As my first year as Principal draws to a close, I look back on an exciting time that was filled with many wonderful moments. There is so much of which to be proud, but not enough space here to share it all, so allow me to share just a few highlights.

At a time when there is much concern about the world in which we live, there was a positive, refreshing constant on 84th Street: the voices of 520 children arriving each day for school, eagerly anticipating learning in a building that itself was undergoing many changes. The scaffolding that enveloped the school and the block for the past three years came down over Memorial Day Weekend. The removal of the scaffolding has added a new sense of life and brightness to the block.

Life was equally exciting and busy inside the halls of Saint Ignatius Loyola School. The students in the Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Grades had the opportunity to attend an assembly with Immaculée Ilibagiza, author of the book *Left to Tell*. As a school, we work together to give back to those less fortunate. This year the students collected blankets, socks, and other items needed to support the Parish's Women's Shelter. They also gave Christmas gifts to a family in need, donated

food, and made Easter baskets for the Yorkville Pantry – just to name a few of our many service projects.

It is my honor to recognize the hard work of the students from the Kindergarten through the Eighth Grade. When students first enter Saint Ignatius Loyola School tightly gripping Mom's hand, it is with the promise that they are setting out on a journey that will open them to a lifelong love of learning. It is with much pride that we celebrate

the academic achievement of the Class of 2009, which has earned \$1,000,000 in merit scholarships.

The end of the school year brings with it mixed emotions. Teachers, students and parents await the ringing of the school bell that will draw the 2008-2009 academic year to a close. Summertime allows us the opportunity to spend time with our families and to catch up on well-deserved rest. At the same

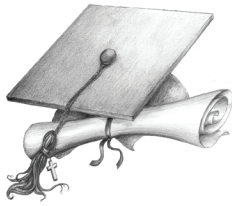
time, there are feelings of melancholy as we bid a fond farewell both to those families who are moving away, and to the members of our graduating class, who are about to start the next phase of their educational lives.
