## From the Pastor: Parish Updates

Dear Parishioners,

This will be the final bulletin essay of the season, so I want to use this opportunity to update you on a few matters, specifically, the current status of *Making All Things New*, and the summer projects we are planning for the physical plant.

The Archdiocesan initiative for assessing and consolidating parishes (*Making All Things New*) is running according to schedule. After conducting the parish-wide survey and Town Hall meetings back in the fall, the members of our “core team” worked over the winter months with the teams of our neighboring parishes to consider what model would work best for the future. You may remember that the parishes we were assigned to work with (our “cluster”) are St. Thomas More, St. Francis de Sales, and Holy Agony.

A very good spirit prevailed at these cluster discussions, with many ideas about how we may collaborate with one another. Our recommendation to the Archdiocesan Committee that was tasked with considering the fruit of our deliberations was that we remain four independent parishes, and that we find ways of working together that will benefit us all and strengthen the church’s presence here on the Upper East Side.

We received word from the committee endorsing our proposal as it relates to St. Thomas More, to St. Francis de Sales, and to us. Among the more salient recommendations in their report, they encouraged our three parishes to find ways to collaborate on youth and young adult ministry, to coordinate Mass times, and to develop strategies for helping people living in poverty. They proposed, however, that Holy Agony work with a parish outside our cluster, more closely aligned to it in terms of size, language, and other demographics. They recognized that the differences between Holy Agony and the other three parishes are too great for effective collaboration.

Just last week, after further deliberation and discussion, our cluster responded to the committee’s report. In a written response signed by each member, we notified them that we agree with their recommendations.

Final decisions about parish consolidations and closings will be made by Cardinal Dolan and announced in

September. It is important to remember, therefore, that nothing is definite at this point. But we have reason for great confidence: We have begun to build positive ties with our neighboring parishes, and we have not been singled out by the Archdiocesan Committee for any significant change. This is good news!

Over the summer months, let us continue to pray for the success of *Making All Things New*, recognizing that many parishes did not receive the kind of report that we did, and are facing the very real possibility of closing or merging in the near future. We pray that the Holy Spirit will both guide Cardinal Dolan and his advisors as they move through their discernment and also offer hope and consolation to those who face major changes.

In terms of summer projects, I am happy to report that we are scheduled once again to make some significant improvements. The most easily recognizable of these will be a power-washing of the church’s façade, a renovation of the confessional on the 83rd Street side of the church to accommodate both its original purpose and storage of the collection baskets, and a new sound system in Wallace Hall. Additionally, we will undertake needed renovations of the main sacristy. This will include new cabinets, drawer space, and a widely expanded closet area for the liturgical vestments.

Less visible, but no less important, will be an upgrade of the fire alarm systems in both the church and Wallace Hall, repair of the fire escape at the back of the Parish House, and restoration of the iron rails and gates surrounding the entire property.

It is an ambitious set of projects. But thanks to your ongoing generosity, we are well-positioned to undertake them this year. I do remind you, however, to please give to the Spring Appeal if you have not done so already. Your generosity will help us continue to keep our physical plant in good shape and to thrive as a community of disciples here on the corner of Park Avenue and 84th Street.
