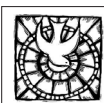

Annual Friends of the Poor Walk Saturday, September 20th

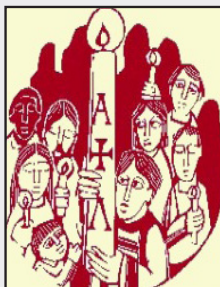
