Fourth Sunday of Lent

Perhaps Today More Than Ever

Perhaps today more than ever, Christians can find a familiar voice in their dialogue with Muslims. We stand together in defense of religious liberty and the unborn. We strive to teach our children virtues like courage, chastity, honesty, and charity. Most important, we share a fundamental orientation toward God and strive to honor God as our source and our end.

These words were written by John Garvey, President of the Catholic University of America, in the Introduction to a volume of essays celebrating the 50th anniversary of the promulgation of *Nostra Aetate*, the Second Vatican Council's Declaration on the Relation of the Church to Non-Christian Religions. That signature decree proved to be a watershed moment in the Church's commitment to work sincerely with Muslims for "mutual understanding and with esteem for their example of prayer, almsgiving, and fasting" (n. 3).

Perhaps today more than ever, Catholics in the United States are called by our bishops to "pray that our engagement in the debate over immigration and refugee issues may bring peace and comfort to those most affected by current and proposed national policy changes.... It is necessary to safeguard the United States in a manner that does not cause us to lose our humanity" (*Living as a People of God in Unsettled Times*, March 22, 2017).

Perhaps today more than ever, the gift for dialogue and reconciliation is something our Ignatian tradition has prepared us for in the roiled social environment we encounter. The Jesuit Conference of Canada and the US has issued the following statement on the recent Executive Order on Immigration and Refugees: "The Jesuits—through our work in high schools, colleges, parishes and signature ministries such as Jesuit Refugee Service—have a long, proud tradition of welcoming and accompanying refugees, regardless of their religion, as they begin their new lives in the United States. We will continue that work, defending and standing in solidarity with all children of God, whether Muslim or Christian."

The heart of interfaith dialogue lies in the conviction that God will reveal something of the richness of the divine to all of us. Pope Francis puts it this way: "Dialogue is born from a respectful attitude toward the other person, that the other person has something good to say."

Respect, esteem, solidarity are all pre-requisites to dialogue. Necessary, we might say, but insufficient. Fruitful dialogue will come only when *respect* is joined by *willingness*, *esteem* is enlivened by *friendship*, and *solidarity* is informed by the truth that we are all God's *children*, beloved and forgiven.

One approach to interfaith dialogue that I have found beneficial is to begin small. For example, choose a topic that is circumscribed and concrete—not one of the immense enigmas of human existence! As the discrete topic is discussed, larger commonalities emerge and we begin to appreciate the profound religious sense that imbues the original topic. The more quotidian and universal the topic, the better.

Nostra Aetate as cited above speaks of the example of fasting that is essential to the practice of Islam. For this reason, *Ignatian Social Justice* and *Ignatian Young Adults* have organized an evening of interfaith dialogue where we will explore the practice of fasting in the Roman Catholic and Islamic traditions. The evening program, this coming Thursday, March 30, will include a panel discussion, dinner and group discussion. We will welcome Sheikh Saad Jalloh, Imam of The Islamic Cultural Center of New York, along with members of the community.

Fasting is certainly an appropriate and timely topic during Lent, and the prospect of learning about our own tradition as well as the Islamic tradition arouses interest *perhaps today more than ever*. If we are to be Heralds of Hope as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mysteries, our efforts at spiritual focus, self-discipline, and the imitation of Christ must be grounded in the penitential stance of humility. In the practice of fasting, we Catholics must be especially humble in learning from our Muslim brothers and sisters who, by all anecdotal evidence, have much to offer us. In any case, we look forward to this first encounter in which we will converse on the question, "What is fasting and why do we do it?" Through it, we will learn to recognize, preserve, and foster the good things we are sure to find.
