Let us rejoice and be glad, Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, Alleluia, Alleluia

Beginning today and throughout the season of Easter these words will be used all around the world to proclaim with great joy the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The days of Lent leading up to this most glorious day were filled with personal introspection and penitential acts. We dared to hope that God would be ever faithful to his promise and not abandon us because of our sinful ways. And today we celebrate God's love. The darkness of death has been conquered by the radiant brilliance of love. Our Savior lives so that we might no longer be burdened by sin and despair, nor the gloom of doubt. For all time and in every age, we can proclaim with joy that in each moment of our lives God is with us and sustains us with love beyond all telling.

Most of us will gather this day with family and friends to share a meal and reminisce about Easters past. We will be heartened by stories of well-being and blessings. We will pause in silence to remember those who now rest in the eternal embrace of their Creator, and we will offer prayers of thanksgiving for their lives well lived. We will take comfort in the echoing words of our Easter refrain. Our faith will be nurtured through the simple acts and expressions of love which we will experience today. Our Savior lives! We see him and touch him in and through the lives which intersect with ours as we share a festive meal of favorite foods and memories.

And now, as I sit in front of my computer to write this essay, I am mindful of the story I read in this morning's newspaper which described the anguish of parents whose children were slaughtered and of children who lost their parents in the most recent atrocity in Syria. Their world is now one of abysmal darkness. On Easter Day, they will be mourning. Closer to home there will be families choosing to live in the shadows so they will not be separated from each other. On Easter Day, they will hide in fear, victims of injustice and bigotry. And in countless households throughout this great nation our neighbors who are less advantaged worry about whether they will have access to decent health care in the future. On Easter Day, they will yearn to be reassured and comforted.

How do we reconcile the different realities of our generation as we observe Easter Day and are invited by our faith to rejoice and be glad? Is there a way to discover an answer to this question? I believe there is. Our Savior lives! We who have been given the gift of faith know that there is nothing — neither sin, nor sadness or doubt, neither war nor terror, nor abject indifference — which can dim the brilliance of what we celebrate today. Our joy and gladness sing forth as we respond to the needs of our time with compassion, understanding, forgiveness, and most of all, love. Our faith makes us bold. Our belief in the resurrection of Jesus Christ gives us joy. God with us, yesterday, today, and tomorrow. That is our message. Now is the day to rejoice in God's love and to be *heralds of hope* to a world which at times seems broken and in need of repair.

May the blessings of Almighty God sustain us in our faith as joyful disciples of Jesus Christ!

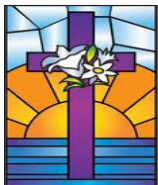
