Ah! Bright Wings

*The world is charged with the grandeur of God.
It will flame out, like shining from shook foil;
It gathers to a greatness, like the ooze of oil
Crushed. Why do men then now not reckon his rod?
Generations have trod, have trod, have trod;
And all is seared with trade; bleared, smeared with toil;
And wears man's smudge and shares man's smell: the soil
Is bare now, nor can foot feel, being shod.*

*And for all this, nature is never spent;
There lives the dearest freshness deep down things;
And though the last lights off the black West went
Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward, springs—
Because the Holy Ghost over the bent
World broods with warm breast and with ah! bright wings.*

The striking imagery and mysterious events of Pentecost naturally lend to poetic renderings of the descent of the Holy Spirit. The anniversary of the death of the English Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, S.J. is a few short days away, on June 8th. Some years, Pentecost falls on the same date, as was the case in 2014, when I attended Mass at the Church of St. Ignatius Loyola for the first time. Though “God’s Grandeur” is not about Pentecost per se, it is about God’s presence in the world and the Spirit of God renewing the face of the earth, renewing our spirits and delivering much needed hope.

Hopkins was deeply conflicted about the role his poetry played in relation to his vocation as a priest. He vowed to abandon poetry for many years in order to pursue his vocation without distraction. A decision that would seem to fly quite in the face of the Jesuit charisms of finding God in all things and the service of God’s greater glory, to name but a few. Nevertheless, Hopkins’s superiors asked him to return to his poetry. “God’s Grandeur” was written just a few months before his ordination.

In 1884, Hopkins, an Englishman, was sent to the University College Dublin, founded by Cardinal John Henry Newman, to teach Greek and Latin. There he experienced bouts of deep melancholy and what would seem to be the dark night of his soul. Hopkins wrestled with his melancholy and the doubts he experienced. He recorded these experiences in prose and what became known as the “terrible sonnets.” He wrestled with but did not abandon his faith, nor did he seem to lose all hope.

“God’s Grandeur” offers us a meditation on God’s presence and power as perceived through the natural world. Hopkins challenges us to consider how we *still* do not recognize God’s authority with the provision of such potent theophanies. Hopkins then calls into focus the state of the human condition. He highlights the weariness and desensitization that our mundane “toil” can inflict upon us.

Nonetheless, “nature is never spent.” Rather, there lives the “dearest freshness deep down things” if we but open our hearts to receive the inexhaustible gifts on offer to us.

It is as though Hopkins intuited his own dark night. At the same time, he was intimately versed with the spiritual physics of the Resurrection, the Ascension and the promise of Pentecost. Hopkins’s last words were: “I am so happy, I am so happy. I loved my life.”

This visceral, sacramental poem offers us much in the way of imaginative reflection if our intellects are not yet ready to ascend to the reality of Pentecost.

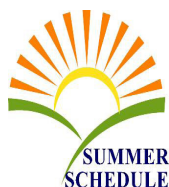
I pray that the Holy Spirit’s anointing will “flame out” in your life and the “bright wings” of hope will perennially perch in your soul, not just for the warm summer months.

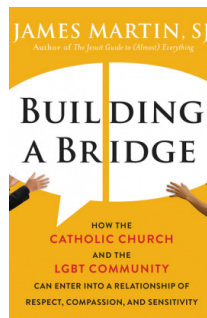
