It was with great joy that I received my pastoral year assignment at St. Ignatius Loyola parish. The history, excellence, and spiritual passion of the parish is well known in Jesuit circles. It is my desire to learn from your own rich experience of Jesus’ presence among His people. I have a love of the Gospels and contemporary Christology that I hope to share with you in different activities and liturgies this year.

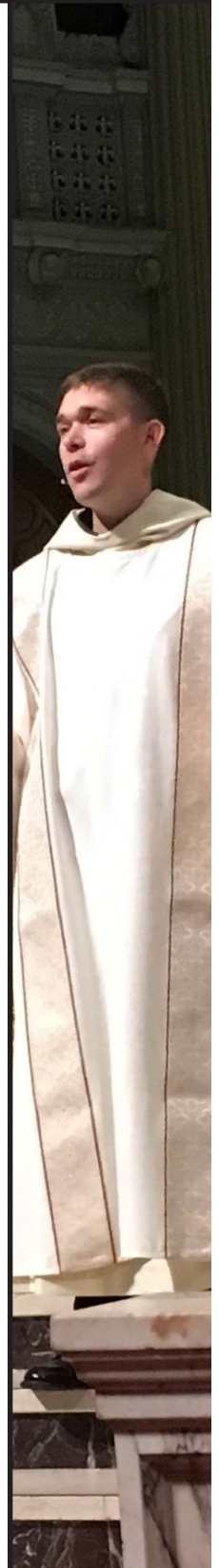
I first met the Jesuits at the College of the Holy Cross in Massachusetts. I had discerned the priesthood since the eighth grade, but college provided me the opportunity to encounter several mentor-priests. Campus ministry offered an array of liturgical roles, student leadership, and spiritual growth. I participated in an innovative new summer internship at the Jesuit parish next to the University of Connecticut. During that summer, I was inspired by several examples of *contemplatives in action*, men with obvious intellectual gifts applied to heartfelt ministry. I subsequently knew that I wanted to join the Society of Jesus. After graduation, I had an ROTC commitment and served two years as a USAF Intelligence officer in Texas and the U.K. A surplus in the officer corps allowed me to apply for an early honorable discharge, and I entered the novitiate in August 2006.

This is not my first time in New York, although I am not a native. From 2008 to 2011, I studied philosophy at Fordham’s Rose Hill campus. I taught afterwards at Cheverus High School in Portland, Maine—Scripture and Social Justice. My family is from Maine, and I have a great fondness for the state and people there. We also lived in western Massachusetts, and western New York before I started college.

These past three years, I have been finishing the academic degrees of Master of Divinity and Master of Theology, at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, California. We have a very international community of nearly ninety Jesuits, and the friendships formed there I consider one of the great blessings of my life. Along with graduate studies, I participated in a parish young adult group and an Adult Faith Formation program. Coincidentally, I worked at another St. Ignatius parish, on Parker Street in San Francisco. The parishioners and staff afforded me many opportunities that allowed for my growth through the diaconate year. I thank *you* in advance for your patience and encouragement in this my first year as a priest.

Discipleship is perhaps my favorite theme in all of Christianity spirituality. As Kierkegaard emphasized, we are to be *imitators* of Christ, not just His admirers. *The Spiritual Exercises* and Ignatian spirituality are excellent and effective means for us to realize a felt, individualized discipleship. This is our inheritance offered by our baptism. At the same time, we manage hectic jobs and face frustrating limitations in this earthly life. A deft balance of authentic faith, works of justice, and conscientious care for creation is the great challenge for our busy lives in the twenty-first century. But I am heartened to be joining a community of abundant talent and generosity, a community which witnesses the energy and joy of the Kingdom of God. As *passionate* disciples, may we continue to be bearers of hope and witnesses to the transcendent God in our complex world.

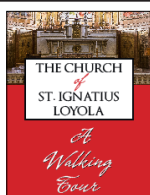


Summer "Temps"
