Stations of the Cross



The Stations of the Cross, also known as the Way of the Cross, is a way to pray and meditate on Christ's sacrifice for us. It is

divided into 14 stations, and depicts scenes from the time Jesus was condemned to death until his burial.

The Way of the Cross was developed during the Crusades, when knights and pilgrims began to follow the route of Christ's way to Calvary. Eventually the Stations of the Cross became an important catechetical tool.

Some scholars believe that the medieval miracle plays, which were essentially tableaux of Christ's life, developed from the sculptured representations of the Stations of the Cross in the great churches of Europe. These scenes have provided inspiration for many of the world's greatest works of visual art, such as Michelangelo's *Pietà*, which is based on the 14th station.

The *PASCAL TRIDUUM*, or Easter Triduum, begins the evening of Holy Thursday and ends with the conclusion of Vespers on Easter Sunday. Thus the Triduum consists of three full days which begin and end in the evening.

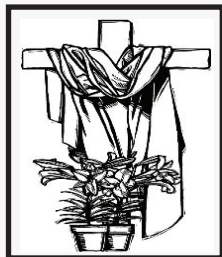

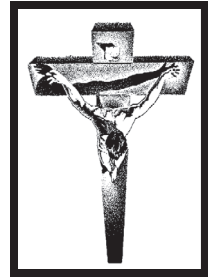
