Hailed by the *New York Times* as "broad, wide-ranging and powerful" and "a finely polished, stylistically nimble ensemble," the Choir of St. Ignatius Loyola is comprised of New York's finest professional choral singers. "A wondrous ensemble" (*Opera News*), the Choir's "tremendous expressive and dynamic range" and "remarkable vocal discipline and finesse" (*New York Times*) is featured in the Sacred Music in a Sacred Space concert series, now in its 30th season. Each member is a soloist in his or her own right in a variety of genres including early music, opera, oratorio and contemporary repertoire. The core group of 20 members sings a demanding schedule of weekly parish worship services in a wide range of repertoire, with emphasis on Gregorian chant and works of the Baroque and Romantic eras. The Choir may be heard on recordings for the MSR Classics and AMDG labels. In addition to headlining at the Southwestern American Choral Directors Association Convention in St. Louis, the Choir also performed in the opening festival of radio station WNYC's Jerome L. Greene Performance Space, on a concert bill with René Pape, John Zorn, Ute Lemper, and Nico Muhly.
